## MONDAY

### SIMON AND JUDE, APOSTLES

Simon 'the Less' is also called 'the Canaanite' and 'the Zealot'. Jude, '(son) of James' was traditionally thought to be the same person as Jude, brother of James and author of the epistle of Jude, he may also be the one called 'Thaddeus'. They are honoured among the twelve Apostles, the first followers of Christ.

Entrance Antiphon:

These are the holy men whom the Lord chose in his own perfect love; to them he gave eternal glory.

*You are part of a building that has the apostles for its foundations.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Their word goes forth through all the earth.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! We praise you, O God, we acknowledge you to be the Lord. The glorious company of the apostles praise you, O Lord. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 6: 12-19

*Jesus picked out twelve of his disciples and called them 'apostles'.*

Gospel: Luke 13: 18-21

*The seed grew and became a tree.*

Communion Antiphon:

We will ring out our joy at your saving help and exult in the name of our God.

## WEDNESDAY Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord in his strength; constantly seek his face.

First Reading: Romans 8: 26-30

*By turning everything to their good, God cooperates with all those who love him.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Lord I trust in your mercy.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, says the Lord; no one can come to the Father except through me. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 13: 22-30

*The last shall be first and the first last.*

Communion Antiphon:

We will ring out our joy at your saving help and exult in the name of our God.

## THURSDAY Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

Let the hearts that seek the Lord rejoice; turn to the Lord and his strength; constantly seek his face.

First Reading: Romans 8: 31-39

*No created thing can ever come between us and the love of God made visible in Christ.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Save me, O Lord, because of your love.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! O praise the Lord, Jerusalem! He sends out his word to the earth. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 13: 31-35

*It would not be right for a prophet to die outside Jerusalem.*

Communion Antiphon:

We will ring out our joy at your saving help and exult in the name of our God.

## FRIDAY All Saints

Entrance Antiphon:

Let us all rejoice in the Lord, as we celebrate the feast day in honour of all the saints, at whose festival the angels rejoice and praise the son of God.
