## **MONDAY**

### **St Scholastica, Virgin**

*Scholastica was born at Norcia (Italy) about 480 and died near Monte Cassino in the 540s. Like St Benedict (11 July) her brother, by tradition her twin, she dedicated herself to God through the monastic life and is remembered for her part in establishing Benedictine monasticism.*

Entrance Antiphon:

Here is a wise virgin, from among the number of the prudent, who went forth with lighted lamp to meet Christ.

First Reading: 1 Kings 8: 1-7, 9-13

*They brought the ark of the covenant into the Holy of Holies, and the cloud filled the Temple of the Lord.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Go up, Lord, to the place of your rest!

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! I am the light of the world, says the Lord, anyone who follows me will have the light of life. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 6: 53-56

*All those who touched him were cured.*

Communion Antiphon:

Behold, the Bridegroom is coming; come out to meet Christ the Lord.

**TUESDAY**  
**DAY OF SPECIAL PRAYER**  
**WORLD DAY FOR THE SICK**

***Our Lady of Lourdes***

*In 1858 the immaculate Virgin Mary appeared to Bernadette Soubirous, near Lourdes in France, in the cavern called "De Massabielle." Through this poor fourteen-year-old girl, Mary calls on sinners to change their lives. She has inspired in the Church a great love of prayer and good works, especially in the service of the poor and the sick.*

Entrance Antiphon:

First Reading: 1 Kings 8: 22-23, 27-30

*You have said, 'My name shall be there.' Hear the entreaty of your people Israel.*

Responsorial Psalm:

How lovely is your dwelling-place, Lord, God of hosts.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Train me, Lord, to observe your law, to keep it with my heart. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 7: 1-13

*You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.*

Communion Antiphon:

Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

**WEDNESDAY**  
**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon:

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First Reading: 1 Kings 10: 1-10

*The Queen of Sheba saw all the wisdom of Solomon.*

Responsorial Psalm:

The just man's mouth utters wisdom.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Our Saviour Jesus Christ abolished death, and he has proclaimed life through the Good News. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 7: 14-23

*It is what comes out of a man that makes him unclean.*

Communion Antiphon:

Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

**THURSDAY**  
**Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon:

O come, let us worship God and bow low before the God who made us, for he is the Lord our God.

First Reading: 1 Kings 11: 4-13

*"The half was not told me"*

Responsorial Psalm:

O Lord, remember me out of the love you have for your people.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! The Lord is faithful in all his words and loving in all his deeds. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 7: 24-30

*The house-dogs under the table can eat the children's scraps.*

Communion Antiphon:

Let them thank the Lord for his mercy, his wonders for the children of men, for he satisfies the thirsty soul, and the hungry he fills with good things.

**FRIDAY**  
**DAY OF SPECIAL PRAYER FOR EUROPE**

**ST CYRIL, MONK AND**  
**ST METHIDIUS, BISHOP**  
**PATRONS OF EUROPE**

*These two brothers evangelised Moravia, Bohemia, and Bulgaria and are venerated as the "Apostles of the Slavs." They translated liturgical books into Slavonic with the help of the Cyrillic alphabet which they invented. St Cyril c. 869 died in Rome where he had gone to seek the Pope's blessing. St Methodius c 885 was consecrated a Bishop and ended his days in Pannonia, in Hungary.*

Entrance Antiphon:

These are holy men who became friends of God, glorious heralds of divine truth.

First Reading: Acts 13: 46-49

*We must turn to the pagans.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Go out to the whole world, proclaim the Good News.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! The Lord sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives. Alleluia!
