Responsorial Psalm:

I will sing for ever of your love, O Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

TUESDAY

St Anselm, Bishop and Doctor

WEDNESDAY Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

THURSDAY

ST GEORGE, MARTYR PATRON OF ENGLAND

Rejoice, you saints, in the presence of the Lamb; a kingdom has been prepared for you from the foundation of the world, alleluia.

First Reading: Apocalypse 12: 10-12

In the face of death they would not cling to life.

Responsorial Psalm:

What marvels the Lord worked for us! Indeed we were glad.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Happy the man who stands firm, for he has proved himself, and will win the crown of life. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 15: 18-21

If they persecuted me, they will persecute you.

Communion Antiphon:

If we have died with Christ, we shall also live with him; if we persevere, we shall also reign with him, alleluia.

FRIDAY

St Adalbert, Bishop & Martyr St Fidelis of Sigmaringen, Priest & Martyr

Adalbert was born c 957-997. He was converted by St Adalbert of Magdeburg and became a Benedictine monk in 990. Fidelis was born in Germany in 1578 and is remembered for his care of the sick and for his preaching, especially among Protestants in Switzerland.

Entrance Antiphon:

You have redeemed us, Lord, by your Blood, from every tribe and tongue and people and nation, and have made us into a kingdom, priests for our God, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 5: 34-42

They left, glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name of Jesus.

Responsorial Psalm:

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, to live in the house of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! We know that Christ is truly risen from the dead; have mercy on us, triumphant King. Alleluia!
