THURSDAY

St Pius V, Pope

When elected pope in 1566, he set about implementing the reforms begun by the Council of Trent. He was rigorous in combating Protestantism, excommunicating Elizabeth I.

Let us sing to the Lord, for he has gloriously triumphed. The Lord is my strength and my might; he has become my salvation, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 8: 26-40

If you believe with all your heart, you may be baptised.

Responsorial Psalm:

Cry out with joy to God all the earth.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! The Lord, who hung for us upon the tree, has risen from the tomb. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 6: 44-51

I am the living bread which has come down from heaven.

Communion Antiphon:

Christ died for all, that those who live may live no longer for themselves, but for him, who died for them and is risen, alleluia.

FRIDAY

St Joseph the Worker

This feast was instituted in 1955 on a day when labour was celebrated in many countries.

Entrance Antiphon:

Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and divinity, and wisdom and strength and honour, alleluia.

First Reading: Acts 9: 1-20

This man is my chosen instrument to bring my name before pagans.

Responsorial Psalm:

Go out to the whole world; proclaim the Good News.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! It was ordained that the Christ should suffer and rise from the dead, and so enter into his glory. Alleluia!
