Can I just say....

This Sunday we should have been celebrating our May Procession. That's just one of the many things we'll be feeling we're missing out on this year. But please pray too for all those children who should have been receiving Holy Communion for the first time in these coming weeks, and their families. They'll be patiently waiting now until the time comes for us to be able to enjoy those celebrations. We don't know when they will be yet but we hope they will be as soon as possible. Those children will be waiting a few years anyway for the Sacrament of Confirmation, that other sacrament of initiation that strengthens us for our Christian mission by our receiving the Holy Spirit once again. This Holy Spirit helps us discern the relative value of all things in relation to God's wisdom, and to act accordingly. The Spirit strengthens us to acknowledge God as Lord and Creator. We are strengthened to fulfil the mission of Christian evangelization, with gentleness and reverence, and definitely in imitation of our blessed Lady, whom we must still honour in this month of May (details elsewhere in this newsletter as to how we might all do just that).

Next week, from the Ascension onwards to the feast of Pentecost, we'll be thinking a lot more about that Spirit, but already our readings are drawing us that way. Both Saint John's Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles refer to God's Holy Spirit. Jesus calls this the Advocate, the Spirit of truth who will live in the hearts of Christians to console and to guide them. Jesus also promises his own spiritual presence in us, reminding us that genuine love of God is shown by living a Christian life. We can only love others because God has loved us first. We can love others because we come into the presence of God's love when we celebrate the sacraments.

The presence of God's love within us is surely something to shout about. Saint Peter certainly seems to think so; he asks us to be able to explain the hope in us. This isn't always an easy thing to do, especially as we live amidst difficult and challenging times, but still hope offers a great promise and respect for human knowledge. Human knowledge is rightly revered by the Church but we don't have an explanation for everything. There's no inherent contradiction between knowledge and faith: the former must be enhanced by the latter. Christianity doesn't simplify or bend the facts of a complicated and often contradictory life; it keeps us open, in search of truth and, most especially, hopeful. This is what Saint Peter would have us shouting about! As this Season of Easter progresses, just how ready are we to share what we've got, the hope God gives us and the love he shares with us?

A PRAYER IN TIME OF DANGER & ILLNESS


God Our Father, each person is precious to You. You are the Giver of life.
