Can I just say....

Should we even be encouraging people to watch livestreamed Masses at home during this time of lockdown or should we be encouraging new ways of praying at home? Should we be so concerned about wanting to see our church buildings open, alive and active again when we should be confronting the very real truth that in this Covid-19 crisis the ones who suffer most are the poor? These are just some questions that have been circulating in discussions and even arguments amongst Christians in the past few weeks. Then along come the readings of this Sunday to tell us all to pull ourselves together. In telling us a lot about who the Church is and who Jesus is, these readings will ask us to wonder why we're asking 'either/or' when we should be demanding 'both/and'. Whether we're locked down or not, we should desire to participate in person in the fullest celebration of the Church's liturgy in the presence of our brothers and sisters and of our Risen Lord, and we should be valuing and celebrating both old and new ways of praying with our families at home. It's only when we celebrate God's merciful love to us in ways both ever ancient and ever new, with both our families at home and in our parish churches, that we'll be nourished to seek God's peace and justice done in the world around us.

The First Letter of Saint Peter encourages Christians to be aware of their job as "living stones," with Christ as cornerstone, to form a "spiritual building", formed in unity, dependent on the free and active cooperation of all those who come to believe. We see suggested in the other readings too the essential characteristics of the Church. Above all else, the Church is where God abides. It's experienced as the spiritual presence of God in the human heart. It's this life that moves each Christian to establish a relation of brotherhood with all others and, moved by love, to offer the same "way, truth and life" to others. The Church, with her simple structure on earth built upon a communion of love is to show the saving and effective love of God for all people.

The Acts of the Apostles today depicts a moment of practical organization in the life of the first Christians and responds to a practical need. There's a division of functions to allow the apostles to dedicate themselves to their priestly task, while consecrating others to attend to the necessary material works and charitable needs. So, as the Church herself continues to teach about herself, the Church is both human and divine, physical and spiritual. There's the Church that we can see, smell and hear, but the Church is too what we cannot sense, whether we're locked down behind a livestream screen or not.
