## MONDAY

### Weekday

#### Entrance Antiphon:

O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Saviour!

#### First Reading: 1 Kings 21: 1-16

*Naboth has been stoned to death.*

#### Responsorial Psalm:

Give heed to my groaning, O Lord.

#### Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! If anyone loves me he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we shall come to him. Alleluia!

#### Gospel: Matthew 5: 38-42

*Offer the wicked man no resistance.*

#### Communion Antiphon:

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, only this do I seek: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

## TUESDAY

### **St Richard of Chichester, Bishop**

Richard was born in 1197 at Droitwich, the son of a yeoman farmer. In 1244 he was elected Bishop of Chichester but King Henry III would not recognise the election. Richard spent the next two years walking barefoot through his diocese, preaching to fishermen and farmers, and correcting abuses. He held synods to legislate and insisted that the sacraments must be administered without payment. He died in 1253.

Entrance Antiphon:

O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Saviour!

First Reading: 1 Kings 21: 17-29

*You led Israel into sin.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Have mercy on us, Lord, for we have sinned.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! God in Christ was reconciling the world to himself, and he has entrusted to us the news that they are reconciled. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 5: 43-48

*Love your enemies.*

Communion Antiphon:

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, only this do I seek: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

## WEDNESDAY

### **Weekday**

Entrance Antiphon:

O Lord, hear my voice, for I have called to you; be my help. Do not abandon or forsake me, O God, my Saviour!

First Reading: 2 Kings 2: 1, 6-14

*Elijah is taken up to heaven.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Let your heart take courage, all who hope in the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you; through him give thanks to God the Father. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-18

*Your Father who sees all that is done in secret will reward you.*

Communion Antiphon:

There is one thing I ask of the Lord, only this do I seek: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life.

## THURSDAY

### **St John Rigby, Martyr**

(ca. 1570 - 21 June 1600) was an English Roman Catholic layman born at Harrock hall, Ecclestone nr Chorley, Lancashire who was executed during the reign of Elizabeth I. He is one of the Forty Martyrs of England and Wales. (He is called "Thomas" Rigby in *The Autobiography of a Hunted Priest*, a story about the Jesuit priest John Gerard.)

Entrance Antiphon:

This holy man fought to the death for the law of God and did not fear the words of the godless, for he was built on solid rock.

First Reading: Ecclesiasticus 48: 1-14

*Elijah was shrouded in the whirlwind, and Elisha was filled with his spirit.*

Responsorial Psalm:

Rejoice, you just, in the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Speak, Lord, your servant is listening: you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 6: 7-15

*You should pray like this.*

Communion Antiphon:

Whoever wishes to come after me, must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me, says the Lord.

## FRIDAY

### **THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS**

Entrance Antiphon:

The designs of his Heart are from age to age, to rescue their souls from death, and to keep them alive in famine.

The Gloria

First Reading: Deuteronomy 7:6-11

*The Lord set his heart on you and chose you*

Responsorial Psalm:

The love of the Lord is everlasting upon those who hold him in fear.

Second Reading: 1 John 4:7-16

*Let us love one another, since love comes from God*

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Shoulder my yoke and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 11:25-30

*You have hidden these things from the wise and revealed them to little children.*
