First Reading: Amos 3: 1-8; 4: 11-12

The Lord speaks: who can refuse to prophecy?

Responsorial Psalm:

Lead me, O Lord, in your justice.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! O praise the Lord, Jerusalem! He sends out his word to the earth. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 8: 23-27

He stood up and rebuked the winds and the seas; and all was calm again.

Communion Antiphon:

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.

WEDNESDAY St Oliver Plunket, Bishop & Martyr

Oliver Plunkett was born into a noble Irish family. In 1669 he was appointed Archbishop of Armagh. He brought the reforms of the Council of Trent to his diocese. He was falsely implicated in the Titus Oates plot, tried and executed.

Entrance Antiphon:

All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!

First Reading: Amos 5: 14-15, 21-24

Let me have no more of the din of your chanting, but let integrity flow like an unfailing stream.

Responsorial Psalm:

I will show God's salvation to the upright.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! I am the Way, the Truth and the Life, says the Lord; no one can come to the Father except through me. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 8: 28-34

Have you come here to torture the devils before

the time?

Communion Antiphon:

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.

THURSDAY Weekday

Entrance Antiphon:

All peoples, clap your hands. Cry to God with shouts of joy!

<u>First Reading</u>: Amos 7: 10-17 Go prophesy to my people.

Responsorial Psalm:

The decrees of the Lord are truth and all of them just.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Blessed are you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for revealing the mysteries of the kingdom to mere children. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 9: 1-8

They praised God for giving such power to men.

Communion Antiphon:

Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all within me, his holy name.

FRIDAY ST THOMAS, APOSTLE

He was also called Didymus (the twin). Ready to die with Jesus, ('Let us go, too, and die with him' John 11:16), he was also sceptical about the Resurrection. When the risen Lord was made clear to him, we hear his great profession of faith, 'My Lord and my God.'

Entrance Antiphon:

You are my God, and I confess you; you are my God, and I exalt you; I will thank you, for you became my Saviour.

The Gloria

First Reading: Ephesians 2: 19-22

You are part of a building that has the apostles for its foundations.

<u>Responsorial Psalm</u>: Go out to the world; proclaim the Good News.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! You believe because you can see me, says the Lord. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 20: 24-29 My Lord and my God.

Communion Antiphon:

Bring your hand and feel the place of the nails, and do not be unbelieving but believing.
