As he walked by the sea of Galilee, Jesus saw James the son of Zebedee and John his brother mending their nets and he called them.

Responsorial Psalm:

Gospel Acclamation:

MONDAY

St Apollinaris, Bishop and Martyr

A native of Antioch, Apollinaris was martyred in the first century. He is said to have been appointed Bishop of Ravenna by St Peter himself. Apollinaris is patron of epilepsy and gout.

See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

First Reading: Micah 6: 1-4, 6-8

The Lord asks only this: to act justly, to love tenderly, to walk humbly.

Responsorial Psalm:

I will show God's salvation to the upright.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Our Saviour Jesus Christ abolished death, and he has proclaimed life through the Good News. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 12: 38-42

The Queen of the South will rise up with this generation and condemn it.

Communion Antiphon:

The Lord, the gracious, the merciful, has made a memorial of his wonders; he gives food to those who fear him.

TUESDAY

St Lawrence of Brindisi, **Priest and Doctor**

Lawrence was born in Italy in 1559 and died in Lisbon in 1619. He is remembered for his zealous teaching and promotions of the Catholic reform that followed the Council of Trent.

Entrance Antiphon:

See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

First Reading: Micah 7: 14-15, 18-20

To the bottom of the sea throw all our sins.

Responsorial Psalm:

Let us see, O Lord, your mercy.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! When anyone obeys what Christ has said, God's love comes to perfection in him. Alleluia!

Gospel: Matthew 12: 46-50

Stretching out his hand towards his disciples he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers.'

Communion Antiphon:

The Lord, the gracious, the merciful, has made a memorial of his wonders; he gives food to those who fear him.

WEDNESDAY ST MARY MAGDALENE

Mary became an ardent follower of Jesus and was present at the crucifixion. In St Mark's Gospel she is the first witness of the Risen Lord.

Entrance Antiphon:

The Lord said to Mary Magdalene: Go to my brothers and tell them: I am going to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.

The Gloria

First Reading: Song of Songs 3: 1-4 I found him whom my heart loves. Alternative: Corinthians 5:14-17

We do not judge anyone by the standards of the

flesh.

Responsorial Psalm:

For you my soul is thirsting, O Lord my God.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Tell us, Mary: say what thou didst see upon the way. The tomb the Living did enclose; I saw Christ's glory as he rose. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 20: 1-2, 11-18

Woman, why are you weeping? Who are you

looking for?

Communion Antiphon:

The love of Christ impels us, so that those who live may live no longer for themselves, but for him who died for them and was raised.

THURSDAY ST BRIDGET, RELIGIOUS PATRON OF EUROPE

Before she founded the Bridgettines she was married with eight children, one of whom was St Catherine of Sweden. She is remembered for her dedication to reform within the Church and her lifelong mystical experience of Christ's passion.

Entrance Antiphon:

I am like an olive tree in the house of God. I trust in the mercy of God, for ever and ever.

First Reading: Galatians 2: 19-20

I live now not with my own life but with the life of Christ who lives in me.

Responsorial Psalm:

I will bless the Lord at all times.

Gospel Acclamation:

Gospel: John 15: 1-8

FRIDAY St Sharbel Makhluf, Priest
