Can I just say...

Despite all that's going on around us, all that affects us human beings so much, there seems to be no stopping the growth that we can see in our gardens, fields and parks. The flowers, plants and grass all grow (and how!), but so do the weeds. The parable of the wheat and the darnel that we hear today is one that can still be readily imagined. This same parable, though, points out something that can be uncomfortable to live with, let alone understood: the mutual growth of good and evil is part of our understanding of God's Providence. This may dislodge certain simplistic notions of ours about earthly success and good always triumphing on this earth; life isn't always like Hollywood. Our human experience of history confirms a much more complex understanding of human events, one that the Gospel, not films, makes vividly clear and doesn't shy away from. Implicit in the Gospel parable is the Jewish (and Christian) notion of Creation and human time as a purpose directed towards an end. This reality of time (the sort of time that in Greek is called kairos) and human purpose (really God's purpose as perceived humanly) differs greatly from the cyclical notion of time (the other sort of time, the one in Greek called chronos).

So we are pointed towards an end time, a time of the harvest when the difference between good and evil will be very crucial, but God's presence works in our lives now and in the world. God's action in our lives is discreet but real, moving us to understand and to want what God wants for us: the true fulfilment of our lives. If we respond actively to this action, we begin growing as Christians. If we are faithful, we will achieve a capacity and fruitfulness far beyond our initial expectations.

So just what are our expectations? What are our expectations of God?

Sadly, these can become all too readily clouded by our way of thinking as human beings and the images others might present to us, not least Hollywood again. We need to clear our minds of vague and misleading images and notions of who God is and what he wants. He doesn't fit into our human categories of thought; he defies all we know. God invites us to recognize, maybe even embrace too, our lack of knowledge and experience, and so to open our minds and hearts to the experience of the Presence that is for us human beings both terrifying and fascinating. Are we then ready for that exciting quest, that adventure of knowing God? We don't have to wait for the end. The grass is growing apace now, this summer time. The harvest is ripe for reaping now. God is revealing his presence to us now, if we're open to him.

OUR CHURCH IS NOW OPEN FOR THE CELEBRATION OF MASS

It's been really good to be able to welcome people back to church for the celebration of Mass once again. As everyone will see however, things are by no means back to normal. We're not back to how things were back in March. Please see more information about how we can come to Mass on the front page of the Liverpool South Pastoral Area website, or on a flyer inside a printed newsletter. You'll see that when we come to Mass, everyone attending must wear a face covering. You'll see lots of other information there too that applies to every church in the archdiocese that is able to open for Mass. Please bear in mind a few other things particular to our church. Please use our car park and please use the one way system for getting in and out of the car park. The capacity of our church is now around 50. This is severely restricted from what we are normally used to. We are so very grateful to all our volunteers who have helped to welcome people and use our church in new ways and are now even more needed helping people come to church for Mass in new ways too. Please do consider if you could join the team of volunteers. If you would like to help by being a volunteer steward, please speak to one of the team at church.

Owing to the severely restricted numbers, it may not be possible to allow all who wish to go to any particular Mass. Please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday to Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6 pm on Wednesday. Your household is defined as those you live with. They are the only people you will be able to sit next to in church before leaving a gap for others. The doors to church will open half an hour before Mass is due to begin. This should give an opportunity for some time for private prayer, but it is also intended to prevent there being too much queuing as people enter and wait to be seated by the stewards. Please try to be seated at least 5 minutes before Mass is due to begin. There may be a possibility that more Masses will be celebrated both on Sunday and through the week but only if we know there are people who wish to come and we have enough volunteers to help.

In brief:

Wear a face covering in church.
More volunteer stewards needed.

Email the parish office in good time detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you.

Please try to avoid the need to queue to enter church and try to arrive in good time.
Follow the one way systems.

We pray that you will all be serving, singing and proclaiming God's word (and going to Little Church) as soon as possible.
