Can I just say....

Not just as we enter into this second period of 'lockdown' but throughout the period of the Covid-19 pandemic, many have been searching for what our readings this Sunday want to tell us about. Wisdom, that great gift of the Holy Spirit, is something we need both on a personal level and collectively across our communities and society. As we seek to do the right thing, not least in combatting collectively this most destructive virus, then we must never lose sight of the one who is that wisest love and loving wisdom.

Wisdom is one of those often-used words the meaning of which, for many in our world, can be elusive. It's good then from time to time to pause for a few moments and reflect on its meaning. It's a word that frequently appears in both the what we know as the Old and New Testaments, particularly in the Hebrew texts of the Bible, a word having a great deal of religious significance for Jesus and his first listeners. *Sophia* was also the wisdom much sought out in the Greek-speaking world too. Prudence is a word closely associated with wisdom. From Our Lord's statements we might associate foresight even more closely with wisdom. Certainly wisdom moves beyond mere data processing or the accumulation of facts. Facts and data are necessary in order to arrive at wisdom but wisdom is something greater than simply knowing facts or processing data. The purpose and meaning of our lives should always guide our choices. It's wise for us to remember that we came from God and are returning back to God.

To put it another way, it's quite possible to neglect our relationship with God and let that relationship die out. Just as the light on an oil lamp can sputter and die out for lack of attention, so too the fire, the warmth, and the vibrancy of our relationship with God can sputter and die out for lack of attention. Wisdom, prudence, and foresight are needed to keep our relationship with God strong and vital. We came from God and we are returning to God.

The Christian community for whom Saint Matthew wrote this Gospel was coming to terms with the realization that the promise of Jesus' return would not be fulfilled within their lifetimes, something we too might have to come to terms with. But still we can't ignore the fact that we believe that Jesus will surely come again. As we approach the conclusion of this liturgical year, though, and again as we begin the next with Advent, our attention will be drawn ever more to those end times and the prospect of the Lord coming to us again. The question remains for us to ask ourselves: are we ready to receive Jesus? Will we be prepared to receive him?

TEST & TRACE

In order to support the NHS Test and Trace programme, we are taking contact details (name, contact number and address) for all visitors, as well as recording times entering and leaving the church of St Francis of Assisi, Garston in the Parish of St Wilfrid. If you have downloaded the NHS Test & Trace App on your smart phone you can scan the **QR code** instead which is displayed in church.

In line with guidance issued by the Department for Health and Social Care, we will keep your details safely and in compliance with GDPR legislation for 21 days before securely disposing of or deleting them. We will only share your details with NHS Test and Trace, if asked, in the event that it is needed to help stop the spread of coronavirus. We will not use your details for any other purposes or pass them on to anyone else. If you book Mass via email, you will be sent a form for completion. If you book Mass via telephone, the form will be left at the back of Church for you in an envelope for you to complete and return to the Parish Office.
