St Paulinus of York, Bishop Our Lady on Saturday

Paulinus was sent to England by St Gregory the Great in 601 to help with the abundance of converts and was appointed Bishop of Rochester, where he died in 644.

Our Lady of the Rosary

The feast of Our Lady of the Rosary was instituted to honour Mary for the Christian victory over the Turks at Lepanto on October 7, 1571.

They recognised the grace God had given to me.

Responsorial Psalm:

Alleluia, Alleluia! Train me, Lord, to observe your law, to keep it with my heart. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 11: 1-4

Lord, teach us to pray.

Communion Antiphon:

Behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall name him Jesus.

FRIDAY

St Denis, Bishop & Companions, Martyrs; St John Leonardi, Priest; St John Henry Newman, Priest

Denis brought the Gospel to Paris and was its first martyr. John's work was extended by the Popes into the work of the Propagation of the Faith. Before his conversion, John Henry Newman was an Anglican Priest and leader of the Oxford Movement. He was canonised in 2019.
