MONDAY

St Clement I, Pope and St Columban, Abbot

St Clement was the third Pope after St Peter and author of a famous letter to the Corinthians. His name is included in Eucharistic prayer 1. He was martyred at the end of the first century.

Columban (543-615) travelled to France and founded several monasteries as centres of religion and culture. On his return to Ireland a shipwreck directed him towards Rome and to the founding of his final monastery at Bobbio in Italy.
