Can I just say....

Just as our gardens and parks around us seem to burst into life with the grass growing longer and flowers coming into bloom, so, as the greenness of Ordinary Time grows around us in church as well, we are given some good Gospel parables all about the growth we can see in nature. But the growth and movement that our readings today are really trying to address is all about faith. The Kingdom of God "is like a mustard seed" The parables say nothing about human action. It's not that they deny it, but it's not important to the message Jesus wants to communicate. Jesus wants to underline the powerful action of God in building his Kingdom in the world. The sower is God, not us. It's God who makes the seed grow, not human beings. The angels of God collect the grain, not human beings. Jesus wants to make clear in all those who hear him that the entire process of building the Kingdom is especially God's work.

We see this too in the first reading when Nebuchadnezzar, the most powerful man on earth in his time, had cut a shoot from the top of a cedar, a symbol of Israel, and transplanted it in Babylon; but God is more powerful than Nebuchadnezzar and, in due course, takes that shoot and transports it to Mount Zion to plant it on the crest of the city to become a tree in which all peoples can take refuge. However imposing the power of human beings, God's power will always shine through in new and better ways. In the eyes of many, God's power can be overshadowed, obscured by the power of human beings; some may even conclude that there is no such divine power. What then can we do just as we come to realize the awesomeness of God's power? A very necessary task today is to help others come to faith, because the power of God shines forth only to the eyes of faith. Today each and every Christian needs to be a transmitter of the faith, a missionary who preaches the central mystery of our faith: "Christ suffered and died for our sins and rose for our salvation." As Pope Francis told us, we are all missionary disciples because we're baptised. It's not about imposing the faith, but announcing it, sharing it, transmitting it with joy and love, making it into prayer, embracing it through authentic living.

Thus Christians make visible God's power in their life and spark a light in the minds of those who haven't yet discovered God's amazing power, the power of a Father who wants the best for each and every one of his children. God uses us to serve his people, allowing others come to know him and all through the power of his love.

ST FRANCIS IS OPEN FOR MASS FROM WEDNESDAY, 2nd DECEMBER

It will be really good to be able to welcome people back to church for the celebration of Mass. However, things are by no means back to normal—we're not back to how things were back in March. For more information about how we can come to Mass, see the front page of the Liverpool South Pastoral Area website. Everyone attending Mass must wear a face covering. You'll see lots of other information there too that applies to every church in the archdiocese that is able to open for Mass. Please bear in mind a few other things particular to our church. Please use our car park and follow the one way system for getting in and out of the car park. The capacity of our church is now about 50. This is severely restricted from normal. We are very grateful to all our volunteers who have helped to welcome people and use our church in new ways and are now even more needed by helping people come to church for Mass in new ways too. **Please do consider joining the volunteer team. If you would like to help stewarding, please speak to one of the team at church.**

Owing to the severely restricted numbers, it may not be possible to allow all who wish to attend, to go to the Mass of their choice. **Please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday.** Your household is defined as those you live with. These are the only people you will be able to sit next to in church before leaving a gap for others.

The church doors will open half an hour before Mass giving time for private prayer, and preventing queues as people enter and wait to be seated by the stewards. Please be seated at least 5 minutes before Mass.

Do take a copy of the *Saint Paul Sunday Missal* if you haven't already, but keep it to bring to Sunday Mass. Do not leave it behind or place it on the shelf. There may be a possibility that more Masses will be celebrated on Sundays and through the week if we know there is a demand and we have enough volunteers. **The more we are aware of who is coming, the better we can place people in church safely and ensure as many as possible can be seated as possible.**

Book your place in early especially for weekend Masses which fill up quickly.

If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know asap so others can be accommodated.

Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you.

Wear a face covering in church at all times.

Please avoid the queue to enter church by arriving in good time.

Follow the one way systems.


Pastoral Associate Update:

We count down to Synod this week although this is really just the beginning. This week I took part in a Synod member Zoom call with Sr Nathalie Becquart from the Vatican Synod office and what struck me was the emphasis she placed on interconnectedness and the aim for the church to operate synodally at all levels. Pope Francis in his address to the Permanent Synod of the Greek-Catholic Church of Ukraine 5 July 2019 said: “it is not enough to *have* a synod, you must **be** a synod.” Perhaps that is something we can ponder as we pray together this week and “become” synod here in Liverpool South. Perhaps too we can reflect on the Synodal process actually being the product: we listen to one another, we discuss and we discern together letting the spirit guide us, each one of us adding a drop of wisdom and experience to a stream that becomes a river, that becomes an ocean. “May we become the Church that God is calling us to be”.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Following the latest guidance received recently from the government and the archbishop, **the number of people able to attend the celebration of Baptism may increase after 17th May. This is subject to the government moving the country to that step on the roadmap out of lockdown by that date.**

The parents, siblings, grandparents and godparents of child to be baptised will be allowed to attend. No more people will be able to attend at this time.

Parents who have completed the Baptism preparation course and need to rearrange a date for their child’s baptism should contact the parish office to do that. Parents who have not completed a Baptism preparation course, after which a date for baptism may be arranged, should contact the parish office to do that.

TEST & TRACE

In order to support the NHS Test and Trace programme, we are taking contact details (name, contact number and address) for all visitors, as well as recording times entering and leaving the church of St Francis of Assisi, Garston in the Parish of St Wilfrid. If you have downloaded the NHS Test & Trace App on your smart phone you can scan the **QR code** instead which is displayed in church.

If you book Mass via telephone, the form will be left at the back of Church for you in an envelope for you to complete and return to the Parish Office.
