## **Can I just say....**

We've missed a bit out in the Gospel. Between what we heard last week, round and about Caesarea Philippi, and where we find the disciples on the road in the bit we hear today, Jesus and three of the disciples have been up a mountain. We know the story of the Transfiguration. We know Peter wanted stay up there but was told he couldn't. And he'd got it wrong before in remonstrating with Jesus about the Messiah suffering and dying. Now, this week, in what we do hear, the disciples get yet another lesson about what true greatness is. This lesson to be like that child Jesus sets before the disciples, to make ourselves a bit less and Jesus in us a bit greater, is just as much for us too.

Last week, the question was all about identity. "Who do people say I am?" asked Jesus. In answering this question about Jesus, we have to ask questions about our own identity as Christians. "Who do people say I am?" Last week was about identity; this week is about direction. Where is Jesus going? Where am I going? This time, the answer must be the same. Whatever glories we find along the way, how ready are we to come down from the mountain and face up to the real glory that awaits us? How ready are we to put aside the glories that others, the world, you might say, wants to heap upon us and face our real glory? How ready are we to do all this when the end, the glory that is the cross, that which lies waiting for the virtuous man, according to the book of Wisdom today and all because that virtuous man stands up for what is right, when that end lies in store?

But that's all for when we get there. We're confronted with two questions today: "Where am I going?" and also, more especially, "How am I getting there?" Jesus, wanting us to be like the little child he put before his disciples, is asking us this same question. As we know, little children just learning to walk or just after this feat is achieved, don't always want to move as quickly as we might want them to. There are things to explore and maybe the odd tantrum to go through before they're ready to carry on. Exploring is good. Knowing that we don't have all the answers and being ready to be surprised by what we find is good. Even though it may take longer than determinedly marching straight to a destination, maybe this is the way in which Jesus is calling us to journey with him in a childlike way: knowing that he's the one with the answers if only we would let him lead the way and reveal himself to us

### St Francis of Assisi Church

Updated guidance on the use of our church building in light of the changes from Monday, 19th July 2021

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales do not intend to restore an obligation to attend Sunday Mass at this point. However, they wish to remind us all of the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

After the legal changes to Covid regulations come in to force on Monday, July 19th July, the following is what will be required in the churches of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Face coverings will remain mandatory for all those coming to a church service. (Exemptions for medical reasons excluded.)

**Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches** and the practice of sanitising the benches after use may be discontinued.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive and the sanitiser will remain available for use on the way out. There will, however, be a section of the benches reserved for those who would feel safer and less vulnerable by maintaining social distancing in church. Benches reserved for this purpose will give a limited number of spaces for those who wish to continue social distancing. If you do not require a socially-distanced place in a bench, you will no longer have to book your place at Mass as previously required. Only if you would like one of the spaces in a bench reserved for social distancing will you be asked to contact the office in the same way as everyone has been doing previously. If you would like to reserve a socially-distanced place or places, please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday. A socially-distanced place cannot be guaranteed for those who have not booked that place in the way outlined above.

Congregational singing will also be permitted from Monday, 19<sup>th</sup> July, and will be reintroduced at Mass in our church over time, but please remember the need to keep your face covering on at all times, except when speaking from a microphone or receiving Holy Communion. The reception of Holy Communion will be transferred to its usual place during Mass but stewards will continue to guide people out of their benches. Mass will then also finish in the more usual way.

We must be grateful to all the stewards for their hard work over a long period of time. Their work will now continue but in different ways as they help us to keep our church a safe place to visit and use. New volunteers to help steward will always be welcome and will greatly help our current team, so please think about offering your help in that way. We can, though, all help and play our part to keep our church safe, especially by continuing to keep our face coverings on.

Only book your place early if you require a socially-distanced place.

If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know A.S.A.P. so others can be accommodated.

These places will be limited and cannot be guaranteed for those who turn up without booking.

Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you. Wear a face covering in church at all times. If you do not require a socially-distanced place you no longer need to book but may simply arrive at church to attend Mass.

## **Season of Creation**

#### World Day for Migrants and Refugees

Next Sunday is the annual World Day of Migrants and Refugees – a day the Church has kept since 1914. It is appropriate that this day falls during the Season of Creation because, in addition to war and persecution, the climate emergency is a direct cause of migration.

**Towards an ever wider "we"** is the theme chosen by Pope Francis for this year's World Day of Migrants and Refugees.

It's an appeal to build a universal "we" rather than a national "we". Instead of repeating mantra's we've heard, such as "our country is full", or "they come over here and take our jobs", Pope Francis invites us to look at the reality of why people leave their homes and countries, often risking their lives. He asks us to enter into the experience of these vulnerable people who are running from situations we can barely imagine, and to pray for them as they face so many challenges, including hostility, rejection and closed doors.

Pope Francis also asks us to become aware of the opportunities migration offers of countries and communities.
