Can I just say....

Our guide for Advent this week is that strange and scruffy, wild-honey-and-insect-eating character we know as John the Baptist. Despite the craziness we might find in the description of this messenger, we need never to lose sight of the message. The message to repent, to cry out and call people to prepare the way for one they might not be sure really is coming, doesn't on the face of it sound all that attractive a message. And what of the messenger: how attractive was he? John the Baptist's physical description is not given here by Saint Luke, but elsewhere in the gospels we'll hear of a man who wore camel skin shirts and ate really strange food like locusts. He's often been depicted as a wild sort of figure with hair and beard all over the place. I've a strong suspicion that he smelt quite a bit too, living like that: all in all, a really odd sort of bloke whom many, you would have thought, might well have tried to avoid.

But they didn't avoid him. Or, at least, he didn't give them the chance to avoid him. So if he was so scruffy, smelly and odd, what was it that made people want to listen to him and not avoid him? Was it perhaps that he read the signs of the times so well that the gift of prophecy given to him, the gift given to him to tell it as it is, to remind people of what they each need to do and who was coming to them, were just so powerful in him that he was, ultimately, spellbinding? This Advent, we need to let whatever was spellbinding in the prophecy of John the Baptist, the last great prophet of the Old Testament, for the people who came to him in Judea, be spellbinding for us here in this place and in our time. For the real truth is we can't really listen to the Lord, whose coming we joyfully hope in, unless we listen first to John the Baptist.

We, like John and with John, must try to see the Lord's purpose in our lives today and be open to hear his will for each of us. Saint Paul will tell us how we can make this more concrete: by prayer. He prays for the Philippians that their love for each other will increase day by day and in that way they will become more and more pure and blameless and so be ready for Christ's coming. We can pray for each other during this season of Advent, praying that our love for each other may increase and that we may each do our Advent waiting and hoping with real joy. In that way, we can be Advent messengers in imitation of John whose example we celebrate today.

St Francis of Assisi Church

Updated guidance on the use of our church building in light of the changes from Monday, 19th July 2021

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales do not intend to restore an obligation to attend Sunday Mass at this point. However, they wish to remind us all of the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

After the legal changes to Covid regulations come in to force on Monday, July 19th July, the following is what will be required in the churches of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Face coverings will remain mandatory for all those coming to a church service. (Exemptions for medical reasons excluded.)

Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches and the practice of sanitising the benches after use may be discontinued.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive and the sanitiser will remain available for use on the way out.

There will, however, be a section of the benches reserved for those who would feel safer and less vulnerable by maintaining social distancing in church. Benches reserved for this purpose will give a limited number of spaces for those who wish to continue social distancing. If you do not require a socially-distanced place in a bench, you will no longer have to book your place at Mass as previously required. Only if you would like one of the spaces in a bench reserved for social distancing will you be asked to contact the office in the same way as everyone has been doing previously. If you would like to reserve a socially-distanced place or places, please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday. A socially-distanced place cannot be guaranteed for those who have not booked that place in the way outlined above.

Congregational singing will also be permitted from Monday, 19th July, and will be reintroduced at Mass in our church over time, but please remember the need to keep your face covering on at all times, except when speaking from a microphone or receiving Holy Communion. The reception of Holy Communion will be transferred to its usual place during Mass but stewards will continue to guide people out of their benches. Mass will then also finish in the more usual way.

We must be grateful to all the stewards for their hard work over a long period of time. Their work will now continue but in different ways as they help us to keep our church a safe place to visit and use. New volunteers to help steward will always be welcome and will greatly help our current team, so please think about offering your help in that way. We can, though, all help and play our part to keep our church safe, especially by continuing to keep our face coverings on.

Only book your place early if you require a socially-distanced place.

If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know A.S.A.P. so others can be accommodated.

These places will be limited and cannot be guaranteed for those who turn up without booking.

Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you. Wear a face covering in church at all times. If you do not require a socially-distanced place you no longer need to book but may simply arrive at church to attend Mass.


