Can I just say....

The evangelists obviously thought that it was important for us to know about Jesus' baptism because we weren't there. In the case of my baptism, I was definitely there. It all may have been done and said in the right way but, as for most of us, if not all, I can't remember. I was only a month old at the time. I can't remember what was said and I certainly wasn't in a position to answer the prayers myself, and yet still I am baptised; still God's grace has been revealed and it has made salvation possible. With baptism, getting the words right is important but sometimes, as with the importance I attach to being baptised with one of my best friends as the other baby on that day turned out be later in life, there are things important in baptism that just cannot be put into words.

Sometimes we might wonder why we need to be baptised, why it's worth all the bother. We're born as human beings and God can only create good so we must be good. That's true, but maybe the fact that Jesus came to be baptised himself and not just born in the flesh, as we remember and celebrate in Christmastide, can shed some light on our need too. Saint Maximus of Turin put it this way. "At Christmas [Jesus[was born a man; today he is reborn sacramentally. Then he was born from the Virgin; today he is born in mystery. When he was born a man, his mother Mary held him close to her heart; when he is born in mystery, God the Father embraces him with his voice when he says: This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased: listen to him. The mother caresses the tender baby on her lap; the Father serves his Son by his loving testimony. The mother holds the child for the Magi to adore; the Father reveals that his Son is to be worshipped by all the nations."

We need both ourselves. We need both the physical birth and the spiritual rebirth of Baptism. Today is perhaps a day too to remember and celebrate the gift of our parents who brought us to the waters of Baptism and then brought us into a deeper relationship with our Creator by their lives of faith. We too need both the loving embrace of our parents in this world and the loving embrace of God our Father. God's love was revealed to us and is revealed to us through Baptism but, as Saint Paul will tell us, it was not revealed because of anything we ourselves have done to deserve it, not because of any righteous actions of our own. God reveals his love just because God loves us. That's what we celebrate in Baptism.

St Francis of Assisi Church

Updated guidance on the use of our church building in light of the changes from Monday, 19th July 2021

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales do not intend to restore an obligation to attend Sunday Mass at this point. However, they wish to remind us all of the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

After the legal changes to Covid regulations come in to force on Monday, July 19th July, the following is what will be required in the churches of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Face coverings will remain mandatory for all those coming to a church service. (Exemptions for medical reasons excluded.)

Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches and the practice of sanitising the benches after use may be discontinued.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive and the sanitiser will remain available for use on the way out. There will, however, be a section of the benches reserved for those who would feel safer and less vulnerable by maintaining social distancing in church. Benches reserved for this purpose will give a limited number of spaces for those who wish to continue social distancing. If you do not require a socially-distanced place in a bench, you will no longer have to book your place at Mass as previously required. Only if you would like one of the spaces in a bench reserved for social distancing will you be asked to contact the office in the same way as everyone has been doing previously. If you would like to reserve a socially-distanced place or places, please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday. A socially-distanced place cannot be guaranteed for those who have not booked that place in the way outlined above.

Congregational singing will also be permitted from Monday, 19th July, and will be reintroduced at Mass in our church over time, but please remember the need to keep your face covering on at all times, except when speaking from a microphone or receiving Holy Communion. The reception of Holy Communion will be transferred to its usual place during Mass but stewards will continue to guide people out of their benches. Mass will then also finish in the more usual way.

We must be grateful to all the stewards for their hard work over a long period of time. Their work will now continue but in different ways as they help us to keep our church a safe place to visit and use. New volunteers to help steward will always be welcome and will greatly help our current team, so please think about offering your help in that way. We can, though, all help and play our part to keep our church safe, especially by continuing to keep our face coverings on.

Only book your place early if you require a socially-distanced place.

If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know A.S.A.P. so others can be accommodated.

These places will be limited and cannot be guaranteed for those who turn up without booking.

Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you.

Wear a face covering in church at all times. If you do not require a socially-distanced place you no longer need to book but may simply arrive at church to attend Mass.


Gifts for Children

Universal Synod on Synodality

Submissions: 10 January 2022 – 10 March 2022



Synod 2021-2023 for a synodal church: communion, participation, mission called by Pope Francis for 2023 was opened on 9 October 2021. Due to the proximity of the launch of our own archdiocesan **Pastoral Plan**, the start of our reflection process was delayed in Liverpool until the New Year.

As an archdiocese, we are providing opportunities to participate, albeit in a somewhat "lighter" way than our recent Synod 2020 listening and discussion processes. Resources and submissions are online from

Monday 10 January – Thursday 10 March 2022. The submissions received for the universal Synod will be combined with those from Synod 2020 and will form our archdiocesan response.

We have streamlined the submission process as much as possible without losing the breadth of focus that has been provided by the Vatican Synod Office. The preferred method of submitting responses is online www.liverpoolcatholicresources.com/synod2023 although email and postal submissions are, of course, possible. The deadline for all responses is 10 March 2022.

A summary of the process and the themes are available to view and download on the **diocesan website.** Further information and resources are on the Bishop's Conference website **www.cbcew.org.uk/synodal-church/** or the Vatican website **www.synod.va**.


