

Can I just say....

Hospitality is a vital part of the charism of those who follow the Rule of Saint Benedict, so many of whom have served our parish over the years. It's also a vital part of the religious life of many other orders too. In this vocation of hospitality they might find at least three examples and patrons in today's readings: Abraham, Sarah and Martha. The hospitality offered by Abraham, and Sarah, at the Oak of Mamre has been depicted in a beautiful icon. Abraham and Sarah go out of their way to be of service to an angel of God in disguise and all during the hottest part of the day. God's revelation stirs something very wonderful and beautiful in the hearts of Abraham and Sarah: the spirit of wonder and awe. It's this spirit that is rewarded with something so very unexpected: the promise of a son. Abraham thought that he would have no posterity save through the slave woman Hagar, but rather God steps in to reveal something that we as humans could not know for ourselves. God's revelation is like this, revealing things that we can't just work out for ourselves and the Trinity is one such example of this. Abraham saw three men at the entrance to his tent and many, including Saint Thomas Aquinas, have seen in this the foreshadowing of the revelation of the doctrine of the Trinity.

To the first Christians it might never have seemed humanly obvious either just how rapidly this faith in Christ Jesus would grow given all the persecutions that they suffered. Saint Paul tells us today in our second reading that he indeed suffered himself. It might seem hard at first to see any good in such sufferings, but Paul was given a grace to see something of the mystery of God through those same sufferings. Again, it's not always obvious to human eyes but Paul could rejoice through his sufferings because he could see that God's mystery of salvation was not closed off to gentiles but embraced them just as much as the direct descendants of the patriarch Abraham.

We find that Jesus too was one for revealing truth in ways not always obvious and we see this today in his saying that Mary has taken the better part. It might still jar with us today too. Surely we need the 'Marthas', those ready to get stuck in and busy themselves precisely so that we can show this Christian virtue of hospitality? But I have often found that these 'Marthas' for all their hands-on approach are also great pray-ers too. You don't need me to tell you that a balance is needed. We need to show hospitality to other people and we need to show hospitality to God in our hearts. What opportunities do we take to do this?

Updated guidance on the use of our church building in light of the changes from Thursday, 27th January 2022

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales do not intend to restore an obligation to attend Sunday Mass at this point. However, they wish to remind us all of the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

After the legal changes to Covid regulations come in to force on Thursday, 22nd January, the following is what will be required in the churches of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Face coverings are recommended to be worn by those who are present in a church building. (Exemptions for medical reasons excluded.)

Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive and the sanitiser will remain available for use on the way out.

There will, however, be a section of the benches reserved for those who would feel safer and less vulnerable by maintaining social distancing in church. Benches reserved for this purpose will give a limited number of spaces for those who wish to continue social distancing. Only if you would like one of the spaces in a bench reserved for social distancing will you be asked to contact the office. If you would like to reserve a socially-distanced place or places, please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all

Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday. A socially-distanced place cannot be guaranteed for those who have not booked that place in the way outlined above.

At Sunday Masses, and other Masses and liturgies that are well attended, stewards will continue to guide people out of their benches to come forward to receive Holy Communion. At Mass during the week, people may come forward to receive Communion without being directed. The sign of peace may now be reintroduced and people may use holy water at the entrance to church to bless themselves as a reminder of their baptism.

We must be grateful to all the stewards for their hard work over a long period of time. Their work will now continue but in different ways as they help us to keep our church a safe place to visit and use. New volunteers to help steward will always be welcome and will greatly help our current team, so please think about offering your help in that way. We can, though, all help and play our part to keep our church safe, especially by continuing to keep our face coverings on.

Only book your place early if you require a socially-distanced place. If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know A.S.A.P. so others can be accommodated. These places will be limited and cannot be guaranteed for those who turn up without booking. Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you.

It is now optional to wear a face covering in church.



Archbishop Malcolm and the Trustees of the Archdiocese have been extremely generous in agreeing to donate the former St Bernadette's Site on Mather Avenue to a Project that will, hopefully, see the building of 11 apartments and communal facilities that will offer a Supported Living facility for 11 residents with learning difficulties and provide a long term housing solution for them. The 11 families have been working on this Project for nearly 8 years and have driven it forward to

the stage where a Planning Application is currently being drawn up. A collaborative approach has been used throughout and enormous assistance and enthusiasm has been afforded by Liverpool City Council Adult Social Care,
