Can I just say....

The concept of 'God's elect' or 'God's people' is one which is very strong among Jewish people. Biblically speaking, this is right. However, we believe that the coming of Christ broadened the scope of this concept to embrace all who are baptized in Christ. This is because: "Baptism makes one a new creature, an adopted son of God, and a partaker in the divine nature..." so the Catechism tells us. According Pope Francis: "God does not belong to any particular people, because His mercy wills everyone to be saved..." Therefore, our readings today remind us of our heritage as the people of God. As God's people, we worship an awesome and caring God. Therefore, we have the courage to look forward to a glorious future of our Father's kingdom.

The Book of Wisdom points out to us today the quality of the covenant through which our citizenship as the people of God was established. This covenant is divine and firm. Therefore, we're admonished to be joyful and courageous because our citizenship is based on a solid foundation. This covenant enables us to share in the blessings and heritage of God our Father. According to the one writing to the Hebrews in our second reading, we became God's adopted children through faith. Thus, we share the same heritage with Christ. Faith is like the DNA that identifies people of the same ancestry. It's the proof of our heritage to the same Father. God revealed himself fully in Christ. Hence it's through our faith in Christ, that we became God's people.

All this talk of heritage is all very well but for us who seek to follow Jesus, who may feel like we've given up some things for the sake of this discipleship, what's in it for us? In this little flock, as Jesus describes us, it might be asked just where is this treasure that will not fail us? That's effectively what Peter is asking. What he finds out is that he, and we in turn, have to be on the lookout for it. Again Jesus uses a parable to tell us how we must be like servants waiting for the master's return from a wedding banquet, which, even now, can last for a few days in the Middle East. We must be watchful so that even if the master comes after midnight, we'll be ready for him. This parable was addressed to disciples but it will also be heard by all who, even today, seek to be those disciples too. The parable reminds us that we should be found about our business as disciples when the master arrives. Watchfulness for this coming Kingdom of God means living in such a way that we're always ready to give an account to God of how we have lived and how we have loved.

Updated guidance on the use of our church building in light of the changes from Thursday, 27th January 2022

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales do not intend to restore an obligation to attend Sunday Mass at this point. However, they wish to remind us all of the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

After the legal changes to Covid regulations come in to force on Thursday, 22nd January, the following is what will be required in the churches of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Face coverings are recommended to be worn by those who are present in a church building. (Exemptions for medical reasons excluded.)

Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive and the sanitiser will remain available for use on the way out.

There will, however, be a section of the benches reserved for those who would feel safer and less vulnerable by maintaining social distancing in church. Benches reserved for this purpose will give a limited number of spaces for those who wish to continue social distancing. Only if you would like one of the spaces in a bench reserved for social distancing will you be asked to contact the office. If you would like to reserve a socially-distanced place or places, please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday. A socially-distanced place cannot be guaranteed for those who have not booked that place in the way outlined above.

At Sunday Masses, and other Masses and liturgies that are well attended, stewards will continue to guide people out of their benches to come forward to receive Holy Communion. At Mass during the week, people may come forward to receive Communion without being directed. The sign of peace may now be reintroduced and people may use holy water at the entrance to church to bless themselves as a reminder of their baptism.

We must be grateful to all the stewards for their hard work over a long period of time. Their work will now continue but in different ways as they help us to keep our church a safe place to visit and use. New volunteers to help steward will always be welcome and will greatly help our current team, so please think about offering your help in that way. We can, though, all help and play our part to keep our church safe, especially by continuing to keep our face coverings on.

Only book your place early if you require a socially-distanced place.
If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know A.S.A.P. so others can be accommodated.
These places will be limited and cannot be guaranteed for those who turn up without booking.
Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you.

It is now optional to wear a face covering in church.


