### Can I just say....

Going to Lourdes on the Jumbulance was the last time I went on a Shuttle through the Channel Tunnel. As it had before, it amazed me then how the driver gets us onto the train. I think it's worth going on a coach on the Shuttle just to marvel at how the drivers do it. It's so counter-intuitive, to me at least. You approach the train on its right hand side. You come to a gap. You swing hard left so that the front of the coach goes past the gap into the train and then swing hard right and amazingly the whole coach gets in. I think it's amazing anyway!

"Try your best to enter by the narrow door," Jesus tells us today. I'm afraid that if I were a coach driver trying my best to enter through the narrow door of the Shuttle train I'd make a complete mess of it. It must take all their training, all their years of experience driving through narrow roads and gaps, and there are plenty of them in Lourdes too, to do what they do at Folkestone and Calais. In the same way, it will take all that we learn, all that we hear and observe when we come to listen to God's word, in order to enter by the narrow gate. The Christian life can seem like a struggle: a long, hard slog to the end. Yet Jesus calls us to persevere to the end just as he did, faithful in all the big and small things. This is the testimony he gives us: to do the will of the Father at all times, up to death, even death on the Cross. In the Letter to the Hebrews we're reminded that we must persevere in trials, even as God uses them to discipline us because it is the loving discipline of a father with his children.

And so we see that Jesus challenges his listeners not to presume God's mercy. The way of life Jesus calls us to requires change, effort and conversion, and a desire to see all that in others too, not just in ourselves. The first reading points to our task to invite all into the kingdom of God, even those from those far distant lands the prophet Isaiah mentions; this is the point of the change in our lives prompted by the Gospel. While there seems to be an awful lot of challenge and even bad news in today's readings - narrow doors, even closed and locked doors - what we may need to remember is that often we're the ones who have closed and locked the door from the outside, not God from the inside. The key is our personal response to him. If we really do acknowledge God and love him, then we might just find the door opened.

# Updated guidance on the use of our church building in light of the changes from Thursday, 27<sup>th</sup> January 2022

Due to the fact that the pandemic is far from over, the Bishops' Conference of England & Wales do not intend to restore an obligation to attend Sunday Mass at this point. However, they wish to remind us all of the importance of keeping Sunday holy and if possible attending Mass weekly.

After the legal changes to Covid regulations come in to force on Thursday, 22<sup>nd</sup> January, the following is what will be required in the churches of the Archdiocese of Liverpool.

Face coverings are recommended to be worn by those who are present in a church building. (Exemptions for medical reasons excluded.)

Social distancing will not be mandatory in our churches.

Hand sanitising will remain necessary as people arrive and the sanitiser will remain available for use on the way out.

There will, however, be a section of the benches reserved for those who would feel safer and less vulnerable by maintaining social distancing in church. Benches reserved for this purpose will give a limited number of spaces for those who wish to continue social distancing. Only if you would like one of the spaces in a bench reserved for social distancing will you be asked to contact the office. If you would like to reserve a socially-distanced place or places, please contact the parish office, preferably by email, to let us know which Mass you would like to attend and how many in your household wish to come. For Masses Monday - Friday, please contact us at least 2 days before the Mass you wish to attend. For all Masses on Saturday and Sunday, please contact us by 6pm on Wednesday. A socially-distanced place cannot be guaranteed for those who have not booked that place in the way outlined above.

At Sunday Masses, and other Masses and liturgies that are well attended, stewards will continue to guide people out of their benches to come forward to receive Holy Communion. At Mass during the week, people may come forward to receive Communion without being directed. The sign of peace may now be reintroduced and people may use holy water at the entrance to church to bless themselves as a reminder of their baptism.

We must be grateful to all the stewards for their hard work over a long period of time. Their work will now continue but in different ways as they help us to keep our church a safe place to visit and use. New volunteers to help steward will always be welcome and will greatly help our current team, so please think about offering your help in that way. We can, though, all help and play our part to keep our church safe, especially by continuing to keep our face coverings on.

Only book your place early if you require a socially-distanced place.
If you book and cannot attend, please let the office know A.S.A.P. so others can be accommodated.
These places will be limited and cannot be guaranteed for those who turn up without booking.
Email the parish office detailing which Mass you wish to attend and how many people will be present with you.

It is now optional to wear a face covering in church.

## Days of prayer for Ukraine

Wednesday 24 August is Ukraine's Independence Day, to mark this, Fr Taras and Bishop Tom Neylon will lead an ecumenical prayer service at 3pm at the Cathedral. We are hoping to have a live link to Bishop Gregory Komar at Drohobych Cathedral during the service.

On **Wednesday 14 September**, the Council of the Bishops' Conferences of Europe has proposed a day of prayer across Europe for Ukraine and the Council has asked that cathedrals and other major churches host a period of Eucharistic adoration.

In response, the Metropolitan Cathedral will be having a period of exposition from 4pm-5pm that day and then Mass for peace in Ukraine will be celebrated at 5pm.
