#### EASTER MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP McMAHON

This time of year is an incredibly important one in our faith. We remind ourselves that Jesus Christ died for our sins, descended into Hell, and rose from the dead. It is a reminder that there is always hope, even in the depths of despair. When Jesus was betrayed by Judas and ultimately crucified on Good Friday, it felt like hope was lost. But, on the third day, Christ rose from the depths of Hell and things were looking light again. It is a message we can all take into our everyday lives. When things are looking bleak, whether it be a personal issue, or a wider issue like conflict in Ukraine, Gaza and other parts of the world, a light can always be found.

- 6. Meek and humble souls, and the souls of little children.
- 7. Souls who especially venerate and glorify the Divine Mercy.
- 8. Souls who are in the prison of purgatory.
- 9. Souls who have become lukewarm.
