JUBILEE INDULGENCE

A list of events in the Archdiocese throughout the current Jubilee Year has been posted on the church notice board, likewise a list of our Jubilee churches. Those who take part in the Jubilee by making a pilgrimage to one of the designated churches, while participating in Mass, Eucharistic Adoration or other spiritual exercises, can receive a **plenary indulgence**. This means that we *can obtain the remission of temporal punishment resulting from sin for [our]selves and also for the souls in Purgatory* (Catechism no. 1498). The Jubilee Indulgence is granted on the usual three conditions of Confession, reception of Holy Communion, and prayer for the Pope's intentions.

BOOK LAUNCH

The Archbishop of Southwark, the Most Revd John Wilson, will be at Pauline Books, 84 Church St, Liverpool, L1 3AY, at **2.30 pm** on **Friday 24 January** for the launch of his new book, *The Romero Rosary*. The book contains reflections on the twenty traditional mysteries of the Rosary, and also on some new "Romero mysteries" : the Mysteries of Charity; the Mysteries of Compassion and Mercy; and the Mysteries of Justice and Peace.
