## PILGRIMS OF HOPE FOR THE HOLY LAND

In January this year, Cardinal Pierbattista Pizzaballa, the Latin Patriarch of Jerusalem, appealed to the Catholics of the world to "Come back as Pilgrims of Hope. We are waiting for you and we need you!" These words were spoken in the context of a dramatic fall in the number of visitors to the Holy Land in the last two years, which has had a devastating impact on local communities. In Bethlehem, 50% of the population are unemployed, 90% have no salary, and 500 families have left owing to economic hardship. There has also been a **95% decrease** in the number of visitors. And in the Old City of Jerusalem, 40% of men and 70% of women are unemployed, 400 shops and restaurants have closed, and 75% of residents live below the national poverty line. The future looks dark as many face the heart-breaking prospect of leaving the land forever. We can bring light to this darkness, and further the cause of peace in the region, by returning as Pilgrims of Hope to the Holy Land. www.pilgrimsofhope.co.uk
