WHITE FLOWER APPEAL

This weekend, as part of the SPUC White Flower Appeal, there will be a retiring collection to promote the right to life in our society. Life is a precious gift from God, and nowhere is it more vulnerable than in the womb. That is why SPUC defends the value of every human being from the moment of conception until natural death.

Despite the best efforts of the Church and pro-life organizations to promote the right to life for all, we are seeing a continuing growth in the threats to life. Several months ago, attempts were introduced to permit assisted suicide across the UK. At the same time, politicians have also given strong support to relaxing the law and allowing women to procure their own abortions at home right up until birth, without answering to the law in any way. SPUC is doing all it can to fight these proposals, and **they have not yet been brought into law**.

SPUC also wants to help avoid the suffering of abortion, and they have an initiative to support students in crisis pregnancy, as well as a counselling service called ARCH ("Abortion Recovery Care Helpline"), to help those who are suffering after abortion.

After the loss of eleven million unborn lives since abortion was legalized in 1967, our society has lost sight of the value of life in the womb. Clever slogans and media narratives numb us to the truth, but we need to rise up and build a culture of life. Please consider filling in the "Join the Fightback" postcard today, and remember the work of SPUC in your prayers, and pray that both the Assisted Suicide Bill and the decriminalization of abortion will be defeated.
